*Affluent Hospitality FAM trip to Malta by **Corrine Mutarelli**, The President 41st-74th Club of NY

November 2025

One of our club's Past Presidents, **Adele Black**, is the owner of **Affluent Hospitality**, a multi-liner that represents amazing properties in countries throughout the world. One such country is **Malta**, the small but vibrant island nation in the southern Mediterranean just south of Sicily.

We were fortunate to accompany Adele on a FAM trip to Malta in early November along with another member, **Sadie Longobardi**, and some other Travel Advisors. Our guide for the 5 days we spent in Malta was Stanley and he was unbelievably knowledgeable, interesting and funny while sharing the rich history and culture of this ancient island and its smaller neighboring island of **Gozo**.

A highlight of the trip was a visit to the **Megalithic Temples of Malta** which are several prehistoric temples, some of which are **UNESCO World Heritage Sites**, built during three distinct periods approximately between 3600 BC and 2500 BC.

The good news is that Delta Airlines will begin non-stop service to Malta from JFK in June. We highly recommend a visit for those who love history, culture and excellent cuisine!



FROM MEMBERS' DIARIES:

Travels to Buenos Aires, Argentina

*Argentina was never at the top of my bucket list. In fact, if it hadn't been for a ticket I unexpectedly won, I might never have gone at all. My knowledge of the country was limited to its fierce love of soccer, football to many of us and, of course, the legendary story of **Evita**. Yet from the moment I arrived, Argentina surprised me in the best possible ways. It is a country of striking beauty, deep history and some of the warmest, kindest people. Even without speaking Spanish, I always found someone willing to help, often with a smile and a few words of English. I felt safe everywhere I traveled, both in Buenos Aires and beyond.*

Arriving in Buenos Aires

*It takes about an hour to reach the city from **Ezeiza International Airport**, traffic being the main culprit. In contrast, **Aeroparque**, the city airport used for domestic flights is only 10 to 15 minutes away. Something visitors should know: some hotels are tucked within pedestrian areas, so you may need to walk a short distance with your luggage. A quick check with the hotel so we can notify our clients that helps avoid surprises.*

Argentina's dining schedule is a cultural adjustment worth noting. Many restaurants close around 2 p.m. and don't reopen until 7 or 7:30 in the evening. But once dinner hours begin, the city buzzes with energy well into the night.

Exploring the Neighborhoods

Buenos Aires is a city of grand boulevards, intimate cafés and neighborhoods that each carry a distinct personality.

Avenida 9 de Julio, one of the widest avenues in the world, cuts dramatically through the city and is lined with important landmarks and hotels. Not far away is San Telmo, the oldest neighborhood, where cobblestone streets and a bustling covered market bring you back in time. On Sundays, its famous flea market fills the streets with antiques, crafts, dancers, and musicians. Many historic pension boarding houses once stood here simple accommodations built for early immigrants—one of which has been beautifully transformed into a Hyatt hotel.

To the south lies La Boca, the colorful immigrant district founded largely by Italians from Genoa. It's home to La Bombonera stadium, where soccer isn't just a sport it's a way of life. Caminito Street, with its brightly painted houses and tango performers, is one of the city's most photographed spots. It's lively, joyful and full of character, though it's wise to keep your backpack in front of you and ask dancers about photo prices before snapping pictures. Don't miss trying local favorites like chorizo and empanadas while wandering. On the waterfront, Puerto Madero tells a different story. Once used for storing crops headed to Europe, it is now a sleek district of modern architecture, high-end restaurants, and luxury hotels. It's also considered one of the safest parts of the city.

History in the Heart of the City

*At the center of the capital lies Plaza de Mayo, the stage of many of Argentina's most important political moments. Here stands the Casa Rosada, the iconic pink presidential palace featured in the film *Evita*. The building is for government work only, the president does not live there and locals say that if the balcony windows are open, the president is inside.*

*This square also carries a somber chapter of Argentina's history. During the military dictatorship from 1976 to 1982, an estimated 30,000 people disappeared. **The Mothers of Plaza de Mayo**, wearing white scarves, marched silently here to demand answers for their missing children. Their presence has become a symbol of courage and remembrance.*

Culture, Cafés, and the Tango Spirit

Buenos Aires is a city that breathes culture. It has the oldest subway system in Latin America Line A. Café Tortoni, founded in 1858, remains the city's most beloved traditional café, and Corrientes Avenue dazzles with theaters, bright lights, and a nightlife that rivals Times Square.

Tango, the soul of Argentina, began as a dance between men before evolving into the passionate, dramatic partner dance that captivates the world today. Its music blends European, indigenous, and African influences—an echo of the city's layered past. More than just a dance, tango tells stories of longing, heartbreak and human connection.

Green Spaces and Grand Homes

Palermo, one of the city's most charming districts, feels like strolling through an enormous urban park. It was once home to some of Buenos Aires' wealthiest families, but after the stock market crash of the 1940s, many mansions were sold several becoming embassies. The Río de la Plata flows beside the city, wide and deep enough for cruise ships and plays an important role in water purification for Buenos Aires.

Across 15 districts, the city comprises 48 diverse neighborhoods, including the largest Chinatown in Latin America. And in elegant Recoleta, known for its food and fashion, grand hotels like the Alvear Palace host visiting dignitaries. One thing that touched me everywhere: the respect shown to dogs. Whether pets or strays, they are treated with affection and dignity.

A Journey I'm Grateful For

What began as an unplanned trip became one of the most enriching experiences of my travels. Argentina welcomed me with beauty, history and humanity. I left with a deeper appreciation for its people their warmth, generosity and with the feeling that I had stepped into a place both vibrant and unforgettable.

I arrived knowing almost nothing.

I left carrying stories I'll treasure forever...


